Science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) are deeply connected to everything we do. STEM skills and professions shape our world and improve our daily lives in countless ways.


We need STEM to drive growth and innovation in New Zealand.


When your business invests in STEM community engagement, you contribute to a more sustainable, resilient community and a future-ready pipeline of local STEM talent.

THE FUTURE OF WORK DEPENDS ON US

When young people can't see all the careers that exist, they aspire to the few that they know.

Primary and intermediate-age children across NZ were asked to draw what they wanted to be when they grew up. Over 7,700 drawings were received.

Having your team engage with young people provides a unique opportunity to broaden their horizons and inspire students to explore diverse career pathways. Engaging with families and teachers collaboratively ensures that students are well supported and empowered to become the next generation of innovative thinkers and leaders.

STEM skills are more in demand than ever. Yet student achievement is dropping. For Māori and Pasifika, the gap continues to grow.

To grow the local talent that we need to thrive in the future, businesses must support all underrepresented communities to see themselves in STEM.

Ecologists from Whitebait Connection helped children from Aorere Kindergarten explore their local creek.

The project involved a community stream clean with whānau, Papatoetoe West School, Aorere College and Auckland Council. Children were inspired to care for the environment and became more curious about their surroundings.



East Tamaki Primary School teamed up with University of Auckland entomologists and Fisher & Paykel Healthcare engineers to investigate guava moth pests in their school garden.

Students trialled different pest control methods and then 3D-printed their own moth trap prototypes.



Papakura Intermediate School drew inspiration from mātauranga Māori to design an astronomically-aligned playground with support from Playground People Ltd mentors.

This project introduced students to careers in construction, engineering, landscape design and more. It also created an asset the school can use for years to come.



Ōtāhuhu College strives to give students authentic STEM learning opportunities. They work with partners like Kiwirail, Mainfreight, Media Design School and MOTAT through research projects, competitions, STEM expos and site visits.

Sustained exposure and support to grow rangatahi's identity and confidence in STEM is crucial to influencing their future study and career choices.



These **Manurewa High School** students developed their own algae biofuel, which they used to power **EVolocity** go karts.

Working with mentors from **Z** Energy, **Unitec**, **Watercare** and more, rangatahi were able to explore innovative technologies and understand how they could benefit and transform their communities.
