#### **Statement of Accounting Policies**

#### Basis of preparation

This performance report is prepared in accordance with the XRB's Tier 3 (NFP) Standard. The entity is eligible to apply these requirements as it does not have public accountability and has total annual expenses of less than \$5million. All transactions in the performance report are reported using the accrual basis of accounting. This performance report is prepared under the assumption that the entity is a going concern and will continue to operate for the foreseeable future.

#### Treatment of GST

The entity is registered for GST and all amounts are recorded on a GST exclusive basis, except for Debtors and Creditors which are stated inclusive of GST

#### Income Tax

Community Education Trust Auckland is wholly exempt from New Zealand income tax having fully complied with all statutory conditions for these exemptions.

#### Cash and short-term deposits

Cash and short-term deposits in the Statement of Financial Position and Statement of Cash Flows comprise cash balances and bank balances.

#### Changes in Accounting Policies

For the year ended 30 June 2025, the Trust transitioned its reporting framework from Tier 2 Public Benefit Entity Standards – Reduced Disclosure Regime ("PBE Standards RDR") to the Tier 3 Not-for-Profit Standard, as issued by the External Reporting Board. This change did not involve any significant amendments to accounting policies, and the recognition and measurement of the Trust's balances and transactions remain consistent under both frameworks. Accordingly, the adoption of the Tier 3 Standard has had no impact on the Trust's overall financial position or performance; differences in classification requirements did not give rise to any measurement variances on transition.

#### Note 11 - Ability to Continue Operating

The financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis. The Board believes that COMET will be able to continue operating for at least 12 months from the date of approval of these financial statements.

The Board acknowledges that the organisation is currently under financial strain due to tight cash reserves and the timing of grant income. COMET is reliant on the receipt of anticipated funding from government, council, philanthropic, and industry sources to support ongoing operations.

While there is uncertainty regarding the timing and confirmation of some of these funding streams, the Board has reviewed budgets and forecasts and is confident that sufficient resources will be available to enable COMET to meet its obligations as they fall due. On this basis, the Board considers the use of the going concern assumption to be appropriate.

Should the anticipated funding not be received, there is a material uncertainty which may cast significant doubt over the organisation's ability to continue as a going concern.
